12TH MAN TD CLUB PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE BACK: Ross Scheuerman, Allentown. The Red-birds senior tailback ran for an unofficial school record 265 yards and four touchdowns on 18 carries to lead Allentown to a convincing 42-0 shutout of Marist from Bayonne.

OFFENSIVE LINEMAN: Mike Garafola, Steiner. Thanks to the blocking of senior 2-way starter Garofola on the offensive line the Spartans got to celebrate Homecoming Day with their first win of the season and also their first points in a 20-14 win over Hopewell Valley that featured 260 yards in total offense.

DEFENSIVE BACK: Quincy Pickett-Stokes, Hamilton. One of the big reasons the Hornets are off to a 2-1 start has been the play of Pickett-Stokes at middle linebacker. The senior dominated the defense in a 17-10 win over WW-P South when he finished with 12 tackles and a sack, and shut down the Pirates in the second half when they tried to come from behind.

DEFENSIVE LINEMAN: Chris Carney, Notre Dame. The Irish turned in one of their top defensive performances in several years when they shut down an unbeaten Lawrence team that was averaging 36 points a game. Junior defensive tackle Carney led the pass rush and also shut down the Lawrence run game as he made nine solo tackles, had a sack, forced a fumble and recovered a fumble.

WEST WINDSOR — The football gods finally brought some smiles to the two Colonial Valley Conference teams that call Klockner Road home.

While Nottingham was off to an 0-3 start with three straight gut-wrenching losses at one end of Klockner Road, its township neighbor Steiner not only had lost its first two games but also was still looking to reach the end zone.

That all changed Saturday when Nottingham put it to-

gether on both sides of the ball in a 34-0 win over Hightstown, while Steiner had Dan Danaso catch six balls for 94 yards and a TD while Judens Gombert carried 18 times for 76 yards and another TD in a 20-14 victory over Hopewell Valley.

"Getting the first touchdown took a weight off our shoulders," said coach Dan Carnuso. "We felt once we got it the floodgates would open."

man Mike Garafola, who was honored for his play in Steiner's win as one of the Players of the Week cited at last night's 12th Man TD Club dinner at the Mercer Lake Boathouse.

As the CVC season reaches its halfway point this weekend the Northstars and Spartans shoot for their second wins Saturday afternoon. Steiner hosts unbeaten Princeton and Nottingham visits 2-1 Hamilton in what has become its most intense rivalry.

Both games kickoff at 2 p.m. as do three other CVC games — Ewing at Robbinville, Lawrence at Trenton and Allentown at West Windsor North. Hopewell Valley will try to snap a two-game losing streak when it hosts its only night game of the season, taking on Hightstown under portable lights at 7 p.m. at the Timberlane Middle School.

The only Friday CVC action finds Notre Dame (4-0) trying to atone of the only CVC losses it's suffered the last two seasons when it hosts 2-2 West Windsor South in a 7 p.m. kickoff at Msgr. Walker Nolan Field.

ND's Chris Carney, the Defensive Lineman of the Week after his nine tackles, sack and fumble recovery led the Irish to a 37-7 win at Lawrence, says the Irish have waited a year to get revenge for a 44-24 drubbing they endured last year at South.

"We've been talking about this game a long time," said Carney, who didn't play in last year's game but is now one of ND's big pass rushers who will try to add to a CVC-best sack total of 12 through four games.
