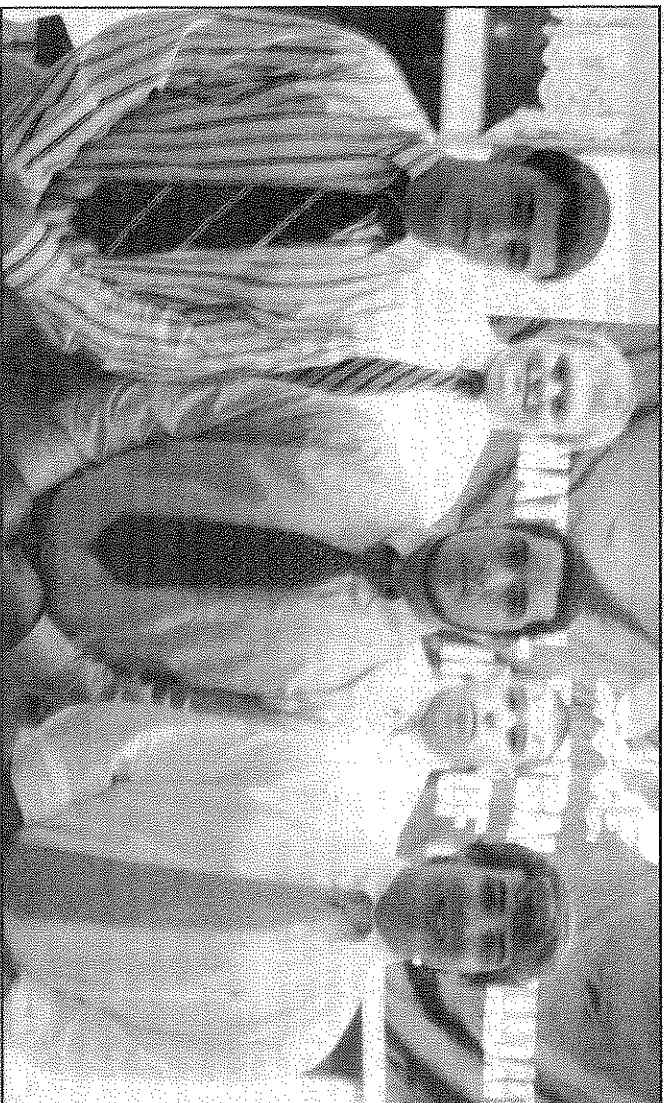

# Solujich kicks injury, stars for Notre Dame

**WEST WINDSOR** — George Solujich wasn't going to let a rotator cuff injury suffered during last year's championship track season keep him from contributing to Notre Dame High's football team this year.

So he became the Irish kicker, and a pretty good one, too. He is the CVC's top kicker with 23 extra points and six field goals.

He booted four of the PATs and a field goal in ND's seventh straight win last week — a 37-7 romp at West Windsor North that got the Irish to 7-0.

It also got Solujich selection as 12th Man TD Club Special Teams Player of the Week and a share of the spotlight at Mercer Lake Boathouse last night for the weekly TD Club Dinner.

Along with Hun quarterback Brendan Dudeck (Offensive Back), Lawrenceville linebacker Matt Netta (Defensive Back), Princeton nose tackle Trevor Barsamian (Defensive Lineman) and West Windsor South's Zack Hundtmark (Offensive Lineman) they were the Week 7 honorees saluted by county coaches.

It's fitting Solujich was honored on Assistant Coach Night because ND head coach Chappy Moore praised his kicking/punting coach Mark Stephan for advancing Solujich's skills.

Solujich, who has also returned from the injury to be ND's starting right offensive tackle, moved to Alabama with his family after his sophomore year, but returned for his junior year.

"Saturday in pregame workouts he was hitting field goals from 60 yards, so I knew he liked kicking on turf," said Moore.

"His position coach Mark Stephan, whose brother Jack was a kicker at Notre Dame University, also kicked for us and is a great coach," said Moore. "He went to Widener and kicked the winning field goal in the NCAA championship game. We're fortunate to have a guy like him coaching our kickers and punters," said Moore. George Solujich will certainly agree.

This week's county schedule includes Pennington School hosting Academy of New Church in a game that could decide the Independence League title.

"Last year's game decided the title, too, and they beat us 52-6," said Pennington assistant Blair Thompson. "You know what they say about pay backs, and this could be ours."

It could also be the first game Jerry Eure's 5-2 Red Raiders play on the new turf field that formerly was on the New York Jets training field.

**12TH MAN TD CLUB PLAYERS OF THE WEEK**

**DEFENSIVE BACK** — Matt Netta, Sr., Lawrenceville School. The Big Red linebacker and team captain from Watchung Hills had 24 tackles, four for losses including consecutive stops on 3rd-and-3 and 4th-and-4 at the goal line to help Lytle hold on for a big MAPL win over Blair.

**OFFENSIVE BACK** — Brendan Dudeck, Sr., Hun School. A 3-year starter in the secondary and 2-year starter at QB, the senior from Hamilton Square led Hun on a 70-yard scoring drive with no times out in the final minutes, then threw a winning 10-yard TD pass while being dragged to the turf to help the Raiders rally for a dramatic comeback win at Peddie.

**DEFENSIVE LINEMAN** — Trevor Barsamian, Sr., Princeton. A 2-way standout for the Little Tigers Barsamian has been as important on defense as on offense where he has 380 yards. In a 30-6 win at Hightstown to help Princeton gain a probable playoff berth he had a sack and three tackles for losses among his five stops while alternating on defense at nose, end and linebacker. He also ran for two TDs and gained 80 yards.

**OFFENSIVE LINEMAN** — Zach Hundtmark, Sr., West Windsor South. The Pirates 3-year, 2-way line standout who has already committed to Louisville, helped the Pirates gain a season-high 139 points in a win over Nottingham by rushing for 169 yards and passing for 139.

**SPECIAL TEAMS** — George Solujich, Sr., Notre Dame. Top kicker in the CVC Solujich continued to pile up the points as he made four of his five extra points and also booted a 21-yard field goal—his sixth of the season. He also returned to play right offensive tackle after an off-season injury and helped ND gain 365 yards total offense.
