

# Princeton reverts back to its winning ways

## PRINCETON 21, HOPEWELL 12

**PRINCETON BOROUGH** — The Princeton High football team got back to its winning ways yesterday as the Little Tigers got past Hopewell Valley, 21-12.

Princeton, which suffered its first loss last week at the hands of Steinert after a 4-0 start, 105 rushing yards from Josh Gordon on 12 carries and a touchdown. Mike Olentine was 11-for-17 with a touchdown, an interception and 142 yards.

Gordon scored on a 2-yard run to give the Little Tigers the lead in the first quarter. The Bulldogs made it 7-6 in the second quarter when Tim Sutton scored on a 3-yard run.

However, Princeton struck back to grab the 14-6 half-time lead on Olentine's 14-yard pass to Doug Bryant.

A Trevor Barsamian touchdown run of 1 yard in the fourth quarter gave Princeton (5-1) enough breathing room. Drew Semple closed the scoring with a 3-yard run for Hopewell Valley (2-4).
